Two Days of Professional Learning:

We are in Day 2 of reflective practice with our View Royal Staff. On Thursday we had a Reading Recovery specialist review the components of reading and writing including meaningful spelling and word work as well as setting the stage before reading. We ask our students: Does it make sense? Does it look right? Does it sound right? In the afternoon we had school district personnel continue our study with the work of Regie Routman in deepening our understanding of the most optimal learning models for literacy. Today we reviewed writing assessment and made preparations in our grade groups for a school wide write to take place before the end of January. We also had a gender diversity workshop and a sharing session of professional learnings from previous workshops. It has been a full two days! We are shared leadership at this school and would like to express gratitude to the following staff who contributed by leading or arranging our two days of Pro D: Amanda Bjork, Amee Ballantyne, Karen Higginbotham, Reese Willis and Sarah Winkler.



Let's make it happen.


Drop books for babies and preschoolers off in the pink bin in the school's front entrance.
