Happy New Year! We are truly into new routines as we dive deep into term two learning! Walking around the classrooms we are seeing Cst. Brewer lead the Grade 5 DARE program, nutritious meal planning, author studies, new novel study groups and the school wide write. Grade 4 students completed the Middle Years Developmental Instrument (MDI) this week. <u>http://earlylearning.ubc.ca/mdi/</u>. Our teacher learning during shared meeting times also continues with a variety of topics including Aboriginal teachings, numeracy strategies that work as the digits increase, and common writing assessment rubrics. There is remarkable effort here at View Royal!

We are asking our families to support the effort, by considering the feedback given at the end of December with our assessments and Term 1 report cards. Please continue the conversation with your child and put into action the steps toward achieving the goals they have set for themselves. These are academic goals, but there are also important social and emotional goals which impact growing independence.

We have worked with the Town of View Royal on the salting routines for our adjacent sidewalks. We welcomed our school trustee, Ann Whiteaker here for a tour of the school.


