KEY PROGRAM UPDATES

October-December 2019 Data Collection and Analysis -- Action Planning

Thank you to all participants who attended or provided feedback for the View Royal Walkabout, which took place on October 22nd, 2019. The results from this event led to the development of the Action Plan, which will be included in View Royal's final School Travel Plan in June 2020.

Drafted in coordination with the Township of View Royal, the purpose of the Action Plan is to summarize the identified infrastructure upgrades needed to support Active Transportation for students and staff at View Royal Elementary. This document also includes a summary of Educational Campaigns and Encouragement Activities that will be ran in 2020.

Data Collection – Favourite Routes and Parking Lot Mapping

The Ready Step Roll program will be working with each participating school to develop resources for parents and students. The Favourite Routes Maps will require consultation with the school body to identify how students are currently arriving to school, while demonstrating alternative routes with safe pedestrian infrastructure that may be currently underutilized or unknown. Natalie will be working with the View Royal PAC in early 2020 to determine opportunities to come to the school for this activity before drafting the final map for the School Travel Plan Report in June 2020.

Purchasing

A brand new scooter rack has been purchased for View Royal! We look forward to installation of this equipment by SD61 in the coming weeks.

ONGOING AND COMPLETED INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADES

- Adjusting right of way at road crossings for cyclists and pedestrians on the E&N Trail (early 2020)
 - Road users will now be required to give right of way to trail users
 - Trail users will now be required to yield, rather than coming to a complete stop at crossings
- Addition of School Zone signage on E&N Trail to encourage lowered cyclist speeds (early 2020)
- Improving sight lines for motorists and pedestrians using the Helmcken roundabout via vegetation maintenance and hedge replacement (early 2020)
- Reassessment of crossing times at Helmcken/Old Island Highway Intersection (early 2020)

- Installation of new bike rack infrastructure (late January early February)
- Participation and development of Parking Lot Maps and Favourite Routes Maps (TBD)
- Participation in the "Think of Me" ICBC Program to improve pedestrian and road safety (April)
- Participation in Bike Education courses led by GoByBike (May)
- Participation in Bike to Work Week (May 25-31, 2020)
- Participation in the Follow-up survey for the Ready Step Roll Program (May-June)
